### Lay of the Land & Standing Alone

**Currituck County is one of only two North Carolina** counties without cities or towns within its borders. **Unlike 98 other counties in the state that can rely** upon cities or towns within their boundaries to provide some level of service, any government service within Currituck County is borne solely by the county.

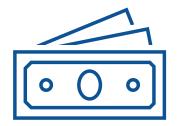
## **General Fund**

**Principal operating fund** 

Major operating activities include general government administration, public safety, education, human services, and other governmental service functions



## **36%** of General Fund appropriations to departments associated with public safety



Proposed that **19%** of the General Fund is appropriated to Currituck County Schools.

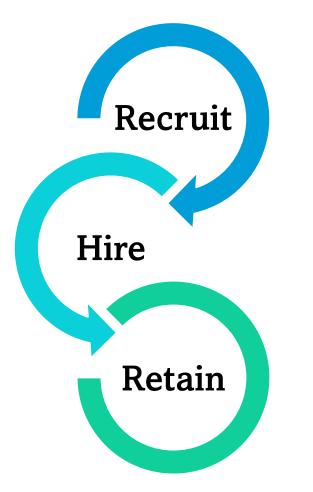
# Renewed focus on school safety

### Investments

- Six new school resource officer positions
- One new deputy position to back up school resource officer positions

Keep students and teachers safe and give families peace of mind.

### Detention



### Challenges filling vacant positions

### Solution

Incentive pay plan for detention officers allowing step increases in salary upon completion of certain training and certifications.

### **Emergency Medical Services**

EMS responded to 4,785 calls in 2018. Response to calls increased to 5,882 calls in 2022.

### **Solutions**

- Purchase two ambulances at a cost of \$750,000
- Program the purchase of two ambulances in each of next 4 fiscal years

### Solution

Acquire property in Moyock Township and begin design of a new county-owned station

### **Long-Term**

New station will require future funding for an ambulance and personnel

Allocation of \$1,000,000 for purchase of four-wheel drive engine that will be based with Carova Beach Volunteer Fire Department.

### Communications

The county recently received a grant from the NC 911 Board in the amount of

for radio system upgrades. The county's match of \$500,000 is included in the recommended budget.

- Replace microwave system

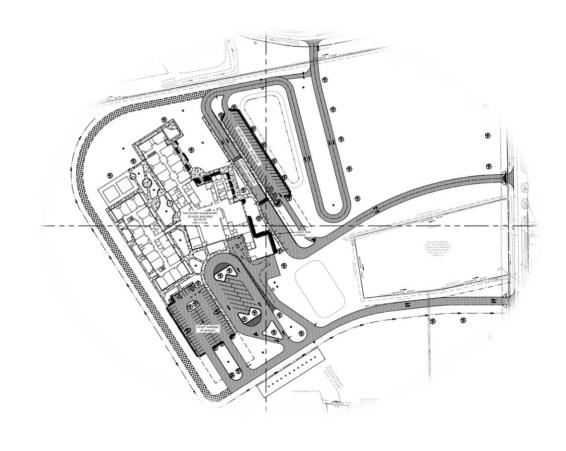

### **Schools Capital Outlay**

Currituck County Schools receives an annual capital allocation of \$1.4 million.

The recommended budget includes an additional allocation of \$3,085,000. Support prioritized request of facilities repairs and improvements over 5-year period.

- Installment purchase financing for Tulls Creek Elementary School
- Estimate first debt payment of \$3,190,345 which equates to approximately 4 cents of proposed tax rate

Ensure access to quality education opportunities from trades to general college level courses

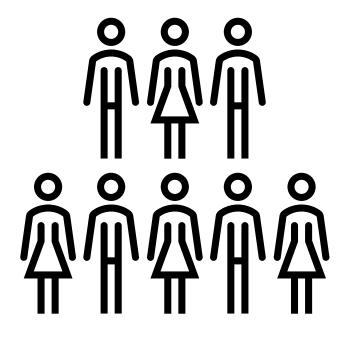

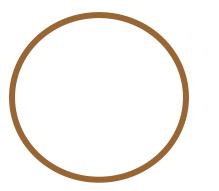

Expend fund balance for projects until it is depleted

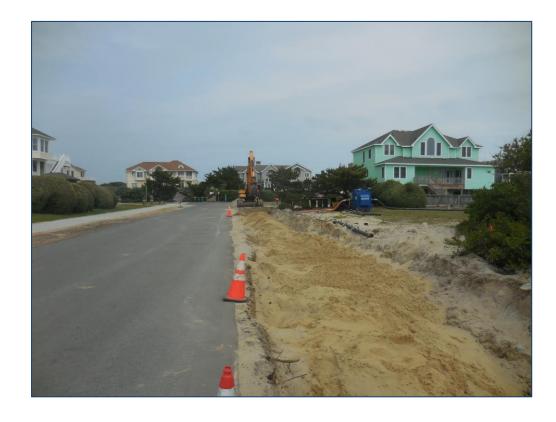
### **Recommend increasing OSN&CP Service District for Watershed Improvement Tax Rate**



Increase rate to fund stormwater infrastructure projects

New rate would equal 25.5 cents per \$100 of property value

#### **Recommend decreasing Whalehead Stormwater Service District Tax Rate**



### Decrease rate in recognition of major project's completion

New rate would equal **10 cents** per \$100 of property value

#### **Recommend decreasing Whalehead Beach Service District for Solid Waste Collection and Disposal Tax Rate**



Decrease rate in recognition of large fund balance

New rate would equal 1.5 cents per \$100 of property value

#### **Capital Improvement Plan**



Critical to determine the need and funding for capital facilities and infrastructure



#### **Recommend following capital allocations:**

General Fund Capital \$4,239,959

Special Revenue Funds Capital \$1,612,558

Enterprise Funds Capital \$6,713,000

## **FY 2024 Financial Picture and Beyond**

#### **Property Tax Rate**

New revenue is not sufficient to meet rising cost and demand of services

**New rate** would equal **56 cents per** \$100 of property value
