AN ORDINANCE OF THE CURRITUCK COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS AMENDING SECTIONS 11-29 OF THE CURRITUCK COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. §153A-121 a county may by ordinance define, regulate, prohibit, or abate acts, omissions, or conditions detrimental to the health, safety, or welfare of its citizens and the peace and dignity of the county;

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. §153A-132.1, a county may by ordinance govern the removal, method or manner of disposal, depositing or dumping of any trash, debris, litter, discarded cans or receptacles or any waste matter whatsoever;

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. §130A-309.09A, each unit of local government shall implement programs and take other actions that it determines are necessary to address deficiencies in local solid waste collection service or capacity required to meet local needs and to protect human health and the environment;

WHEREAS, Currituck County's northern beaches are rich with wildlife, specifically wild horses and other animals; and

WHEREAS, human contact with these animals pose substantial risks for both humans and the animals; and

WHEREAS, solid waste receptacles and enclosed structures that are inadequate to protect its contents from animals such as wild horses draw these animals into residential areas, increasing the likelihood of contact with humans, and the likelihood animals would ingest the contents of the receptacles; and

WHEREAS, the County of Currituck desires to amend the existing ordinance to require that enclosed structures include sufficient animal proof qualities and are made of components that limit animal exposure to solid waste and human interaction.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Currituck, North Carolina as follows:

PART I. Sec. 11-29 of The Code of Ordinances, Currituck County, North Carolina is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 11-29. Enclosure of roll-out carts; SFR zoning district.

(A) The owner of any property in the SFR zoning district shall construct an enclosure in which to store solid waste receptacles. Such enclosure shall be four-sided and constructed of wood, concrete, block, brick or other material as approved by the building inspector. Such enclosure shall allow for ventilation and accessibility by the sanitation company. The enclosure shall be placed within four feet of the right-of-way. The enclosure shall be

- 1 constructed within 60 days of the adoption of the ordinance from which this section derives.
  - (B) This section shall only apply to those owners, occupants, tenants, or lessees utilizing a commercial service pick-up. Any owner, occupant, tenant, or lessee disposing of his or her own solid waste at a county solid-waste facility shall not be required to construct an enclosure in which to store solid waste receptacles.
    - (C) The enclosure shall be non-reflective, non-shiny black or brown or green structure resistant to rust, corrosion, or rapid deterioration, with a bottom and sides that are of sufficient size and strength to prevent wind, animals, or fowl from spilling solid wastes from the receptables stored therein. Said enclosed area shall be constructed so as to keep the bottom of the receptacles off the ground and shall have a cover over the top of the structure that will prevent weather elements from directly entering the Enclosed Structure. This Enclosed Structure must be one which is:
      - (1) <u>Specifically designed and marketed by its manufacturer as being animal proof or animal resistant by virtue of containing qualities and features specifically designed to prevent animals from accessing its contents; or</u>
      - (2) <u>Is approved by the Public Works Director or his or her designee as having sufficient animal resistant qualities or features.</u>
  - (D) Solid waste receptacles that meet the requirements of this ordinance need not be placed in an Enclosed Structure if they are placed curbside no earlier than 6:00 A.M. the morning of trash pickup, except that the Public Works Director or his or her designee may require a solid waste receptacle that otherwise meets this requirement to be placed within the Enclosed Structure if its contents are spilled on more than one (1) occasion. Solid waste receptacles not placed within an Enclosed Structure shall be removed from the curb by the property owner by the end of each day of trash pickup.
  - (E) Any Enclosed Structure or solid waste receptacle that does not meet the requirements of this ordinance on or before January 1, 2024 shall be excluded from- and ineligible for-receiving any contracted solid waste disposal service from the County of Currituck.
  - (F) Any Enclosed Structure that has become dilapidated, rotten, rusted, or fallen into a state of disrepair or disuse shall be removed from the property by the property owner.

## (G)Enforcement

(1) <u>Civil Penalty</u>. Any person who is found in violation of this chapter shall be subject to a civil penalty of not to exceed \$500.00 as provided in N.C.G.S. \$153A-123. Each day's violation shall be treated as a separate offense.

1	(2) Remedies. This section may be enforced by equitable remedies, and any unlawful
2	condition existing or in violation of this chapter may be enforced by injunction
3	and order of abatement in accordance with N.C.G.S. §153A-123.
4	All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.
5	PART III. This ordinance is effective six (6) months after its adoption.
