RECYCLING IN CURRITUCK COUNTY


Designed for residents of Currituck County, this easy reference guide on the county's waste and recycling services tells how to properly prepare your recyclables and dispose of other special wastes.

The county operates eight staffed convenience drop-off centers listed on the back of this brochure. These convenience centers are for **residential waste and recycling only.** County residents **MUST** have a solid waste permit decal displayed on their vehicle's windshield when utilizing one of the centers. All commercial and business waste generators must contract with a private waste hauler or take waste directly to the Transfer Station.

COROLLA CURBSIDE SERVICE:

Currituck County provides Corolla residents one recycling container per house through Bay Disposal, Inc. Recycling is picked up twice a week on trash collection day. Contact the Currituck County Public Works Department for more information.

*Every spring Public Works organizes a Household Hazardous Waste Event, which allows citizens to get rid of waste that is not easily disposed of at our current facilities.

ALSO ACCEPTED

The following items also are accepted for recycling and proper disposal at the county convenience centers. NO business and commercial waste. For additional restrictions, see the site attendant.

Yard Waste

Lawn clippings and limbs less than 8 feet long and 4 inches in diameter. Take yard waste



greater than a 5×8 foot truck-bed-sized load to the Transfer Station.

White Goods/Mixed Metal

Washing machines, stoves, metal bed frames, bicycles, etc. Take items containing FREON to the Transfer Station.



Electronic Waste Computers, televisions, telephone systems, etc. (Not available at Grandy).



Automotive Products Antifreeze, used motor oil and filters, lead acid batteries and tires from personal vehicles (remove rims).

Cooking Oil Now accepted at all sites in the tan colored cooking oil recycling container.

Bulky Waste Large household items like mattresses, carpet, etc.

Household Garbage All bagged garbage should be placed in the compactor.

Construction and Debris Wood construction, remodeling debris, bricks, etc. Take commercial and business generated C&D waste to the Transfer Station.
